Dear Parents and Students,

As the Winter Concert approaches, this letter contains some important information. Please keep it handy to answer some questions you may have.

The date of the Winter Concert is Thursday, December 16th. Please remember that performance at the concert is *mandatory* for all students. The concert begins at 7:30pm; the reporting time for all choral students is no later than 7:00pm .

Chorale will be the 1st choral group to perform, "Crescendo" will be the next choral group, and the Concert Choir will be the the final choral group. Of course, the instrumental groups will alternate with the choral groups. As with past Winter Concerts, the Wind Ensemble, Chorale, and Concert Choir will close the concert with a combined "grand finale".

In the past, entire Calhoun music faculty has worked hard to make the concert flow. We've had great success in keeping the audience until the end of the concert. If you must leave early and your child only performs in the first half of the concert, we ask that you leave during the intermission only, so as not to distract the performers and make for a more professional concert.

The concert dress is as follows:

Men: Black Slacks  
Black Collared Shirt  
Black Shoes  
Black Socks

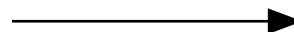
Women: Black Skirt (knee length or lower)  
or Black Pants  
Black Top  
(no imprints/ no 'baby-t's'/ no bare midriffs/ no spaghetti-straps)  
Black Tights/ Stockings/ Socks  
Black Shoes  
(NO high spike heels/ NO open heel for safety)

Concert Choirs-  
(Under Robes)

Men: Black Slacks  
White Dress Shirt  
(long sleeve)  
Black Socks and Shoes  
Any Color Long Tie

Women: Clothing that cannot be seen w/ robe on  
Tan Color Tights/ Stockings  
Black Shoes  
(NO high spike heels/ NO open heel for safety)

A uniform look is essential to the professionalism of the group. Therefore we will not allow a member of any group to perform if he or she is dressed inappropriately. In many cases, as in footwear, this is a safety precaution; in other cases, this decision is made to be fair to the rest of the group. If you have a question about clothing, please bring it in and ask (some students have already done so). Your attention to detail will be greatly appreciated.

A working dress rehearsal for all choral dept. students will be scheduled for Monday, December 13th from 5:30-7:30pm in the Calhoun auditorium. This will be the final opportunity to rehearse on the choral risers, to practice entering and leaving the stage, and it will be a chance for each group to see what the others are doing.

The school's policy on photography and video at concerts follows. We ask that audience members do not come down the aisles to the front row in order to photograph or video their child. Firstly, it is dangerous (there will be sound and light power cables everywhere that the students have practiced navigating). Secondly, it is extremely distracting for both the singers (who are nervous enough) and the rest of the audience. If you must video/photograph, please do it from the rear half of the auditorium. This will make for a more professional concert that all the students have worked very hard to perfect. We thank you in advance.

We hope that when you hear the groups perform in December you will be as proud of them as we are.
